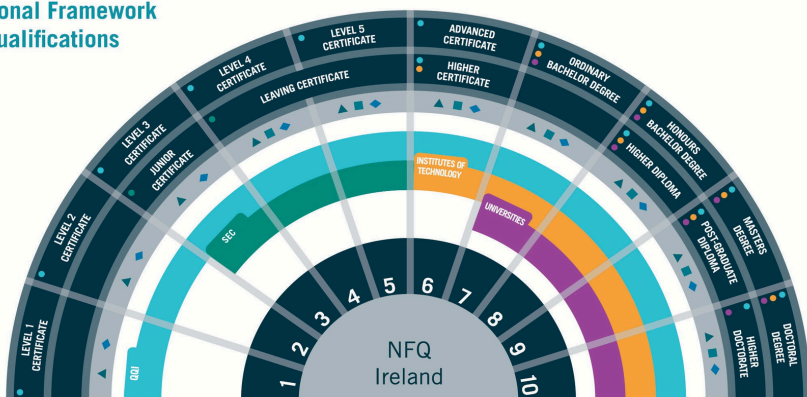

CEFR B2+, as determined by the sending university under our partnership arrangements. Pre-semester English classes also available

### Course Overview

Spend one semester at Dorset College selecting modules from Business NFQ Level 7/8 and/or Computing at NFQ Levels 7 (Years 2–4).

Teaching is face-to-face by experienced lecturers with strong industry engagement.

A typical load is 30 ECTS, mapped to your Learning Agreement.

### Accommodation

Semester Abroad students typically book purpose-built residences or short-term rentals within 20–30 minutes of our Dublin 1 campus. We work with accommodation partners and share guidance and partner links after nomination; availability is limited, so please book early (especially for September).

# Visas & Immigration

## Do I need a visa?

- EU/EEA & Swiss nationals: no Irish visa required.
- Other nationalities: some are non-visa-required (can enter without a visa), others are visa-required. Please check your status before you apply or travel.

## Study visa (Long-Stay “D”)

If you are visa-required and your course lasts more than 3 months, apply for a Long-Stay Study (“D”) visa up to 3 months before travelling.

## Financial requirements (living costs)

Minimum living-cost funds required by the Irish authorities (separate from tuition fees):

One academic year (~12 months): €10,000

6–8 months: €833 per month (e.g. €6,665 for 8 months)

*Degree-programme students may use an approved education bond (min. €10,000 for each year of study) as an alternative form of financial evidence.*

## What you typically need

Exact documents vary by country and course. You should expect to provide:

- Offer/acceptance letter from Dorset College (programme listed on the ILEP)
- Evidence of tuition-fee payment (or approved education bond for degree students)
- Proof of finances meeting the thresholds above (bank statements and/or bond; sponsor evidence if applicable)
- Valid passport and completed visa application
- Private medical insurance
- English-language proficiency as required by your programme

## On arrival & registration

At the border, carry your acceptance letter, proof of fee payment, financial evidence and insurance. If you are a non-EU/EEA/Swiss national staying over 90 days, you must register your immigration permission and obtain an IRP card after you start classes in Dublin.

# Accommodation

Finding a place to live in Dublin takes planning, but you won't be doing it alone. Our Student Experience team can advise on options and timelines and most students secure housing within an easy commute of our city-centre buildings, with excellent access to DART, Luas, bus and rail.

## Accommodation Types

### Residence

Single or shared rooms in student-only residences, typically within walking distance of campus and the city centre. Social environments with essentials provided.

### Host Family (Homestay)

A single or double room in a local home, breakfast and evening meal included, everyday English practice and a straightforward commute (often 1–5 km).

### Short-Term (Hotels & Hostels)

Ideal for your first days while you attend viewings and finalise a longer-term option; single or shared rooms near campus and city centre.

### Private Rentals / House-share

Independent living in apartments or shared houses. Start early and use reputable platforms (e.g., [Daft.ie](http://Daft.ie), [Rent.ie](http://Rent.ie), [MyHome.ie](http://MyHome.ie)).

### How to Secure Your Place

- **Start early.** Demand rises before each semester.
- **Have a back-up plan.** Book short-term accommodation while you view long-term options.
- **Bring documents.** Photo ID, proof of enrolment, references and deposit funds help you move quickly.

### Safety Tips

Never pay any money before an in-person viewing, a signed agreement and keys. Ask about deposits, utilities, house rules and notice periods before committing. Remember, if you are not sure, talk to us before you proceed.

### Warning Signs

- No viewing allowed
- “Too good to be true” price
- Landlord “abroad” asking you to pay now
- Cash/crypto/gift-card requests
- Pressure to decide immediately
- Asked to send passport scans or large deposits before viewing

## What you will study

A balanced programme covering grammar, vocabulary, and the four skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing). Lessons use a communicative, task-based approach, with lots of practice speaking about everyday situations.

You will get attention to pronunciation from the early stages, weekly progress tests and regular feedback to keep you on track.

## Course Overview

Build real-world English for life, study, work and travel with experienced teachers in a friendly, central Dublin school. Classes focus on fluency and accuracy, so you gain confidence using English day to day while progressing steadily. ## Optional one-to-one lessons

If you want extra focus (e.g., pronunciation, exam preparation or job-specific language), you can book private 1:1 lessons scheduled around your timetable. These sessions complement your main class without needing to take both morning and afternoon group lessons.

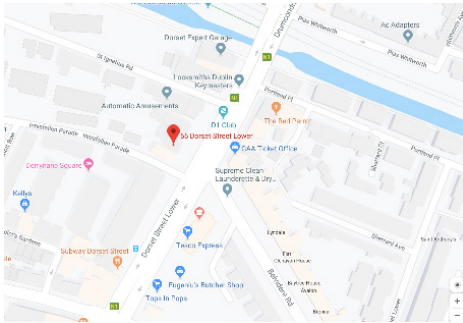

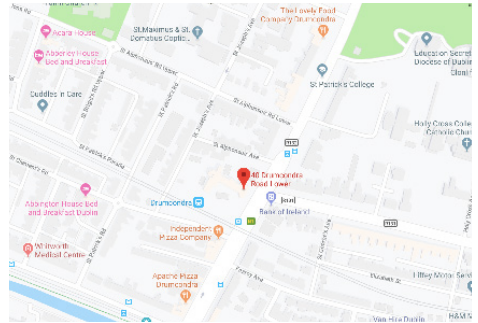
